means \_\_\_\_\_ and not reacting (Nehemiah 1:11 and 2:1 NIV)

We must stop running around long enough to see what he has done and is doing. We must shut up long enough to hear what he has said and is saying. All our ancestors agree that without silence and stillness there is no spirituality, no God-attentive, God-responsive life.

#### allows us to see the (Nehemiah 2:11-17 NIV)

I went to Jerusalem, and after staying there three days I set out during the night with a few others. I had not told anyone what my God had put in my heart to do for Jerusalem. There were no mounts with me except the one I was riding on. (vs. 11-12)

is only possible when the \_\_\_\_\_ is not setting the agenda (Nehemiah 4:10-15 NIV)

Meanwhile, the people in Judah said, "The strength of the laborers is aiving out, and there is so much rubble that we cannot rebuild the wall."

Also our enemies said, "Before they know it or see us, we will be right there among them and will kill them and put an end to the work."

Then the Jews who lived near them came and told us ten times over, "Wherever you turn, they will attack us." (vs. 10-12)

## means recognizing God's hand in the \_\_\_\_\_

### (Nehemiah 5:1-13 NIV)

What if our interruptions are in fact our opportunities, if they are challenges to an inner response by which growth takes place and through which we come to the fullness of being? What if the events of our history are molding us as a sculptor moulds his clay, and if it is only in careful obedience to these molding hands that we can discover our real vocation and become real people? ~ Henri Nouwen

- means \_\_\_\_\_\_ doesn't set the agenda (Nehemiah 6:2-9 NIV) They were all trying to frighten us, thinking, "Their hands will get too weak for the work, and it will not be completed." But I prayed, "Now *strengthen my hands*". (vs. 9)
- means not trying to escape the \_\_\_\_\_ God has called you to (Nehemiah 6:10-14)

But I said. "Should a man like me run away? Or should someone like me go into the temple to save his life? I will not go!" (vs. 11)

means establishing a \_\_\_\_\_ (Nehemiah 10:31-33 NIV) 

Sabbath is a deliberate act of interference, an interruption of our work each week, a decree of no-work so that we are able to notice, to attend, to listen, to assimilate this comprehensive and majestic work of God, to orient our work in the work of God. ~ Eugene Peterson

means learning from our \_\_\_\_\_ (Nehemiah 13:15-22 NIV)

Un-sabbathed, our work becomes the entire context in which we define our lives. We lose God-consciousness, God-awareness, sightings of resurrection. We lose the capacity to sing "This is my Father's world" and end up chirping little self-centered ditties about what we are doing and feeling. ~ Eugene Peterson
