Mark 16:1-7 NLT

"Fear is a liar..."

Saturday evening, when the Sabbath ended, Mary Magdalene, Mary mother of James, and Salome went out and purchased burial spices so they could anoint Jesus' body. Very early on Sunday morning, just at sunrise, they went to the tomb. On the way they were asking each other, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" But as they arrived, they looked up and saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled aside.

When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a white robe sitting on the right side. The women were shocked, but the angel said, "Don't be alarmed. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He isn't here! He is risen from the dead! Look, this is where they laid his body. Now go and tell his disciples, **including Peter**, that Jesus is going ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there, just as he told you before he died."

Apprenticeship Prayer Partner Questions:

- 1. Where are you most susceptible to fear or shame and how would you describe their effects on your life presently? What do you think Jesus wants to say to you about these things?
- 2. Ask your APP/Spouse/Trusted friend Is there anything you see in me a pattern of thinking, a habit, a way of responding to people that seems to be holding me back? (Perhaps indicating that you're still wearing some kind of 'grave clothes'?)
